

IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

December 8, 2023

In the Gospel of Luke, an angel visits a young woman in Nazareth named Mary and asks if she will bear the Messiah. Mary says yes. Then, Mary becomes pregnant with Jesus. This is known as the Immaculate Conception, right?

Wrong. Even though many Catholics connect this story in Luke's Gospel with the term Immaculate Conception, the doctrine itself refers to something different. It still refers to Mary, but it is not about how Mary became pregnant with Jesus. It is about how Mary's **mother** became pregnant with her — deemed immaculate due to the absence of transmitting original sin.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains the Immaculate Conception this way:

Since it would not be fitting for the Mother of Christ to have resided in the impurity of sin in any form, the Father blessed Mary more than any other created person "in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places" and chose her "in Christ before the foundation of the world, to be holy and blameless before him in love".

And so, from the first instant of her conception, Mary was totally preserved from the stain of original sin

and she remained pure from all personal sin throughout her life.

In *Ineffabilis Deus* by Pope BI. Pius IX – 1854, he writes, "and indeed it was wholly fitting that so wonderful a mother should be ever resplendent with the glory of the most sublime holiness and so completely free from all taint of original sin that she would triumph utterly over the ancient serpent."

ATTEND ONE (1) FROM EACH COLUMN

FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Obligation may be fulfilled at any Mass after 3:00 p.m. on Saturday, Dec. 23 through Sunday, Dec. 24 at 3:00 p.m.

Obligation may be fulfilled at either:

- A Vigil (Saturday evening) Mass
- Any Mass of the Fourth Sunday of Advent before 3:00 p.m.

NATIVITY OF THE LORD (CHRISTMAS)

Obligation may be fulfilled at any Mass after 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, Dec. 24 and throughout Monday, Dec. 25

Obligation may be fulfilled at either:

- A Vigil Mass for Christmas on Sunday, Dec. 24
- Any Mass on Monday, Dec. 25
